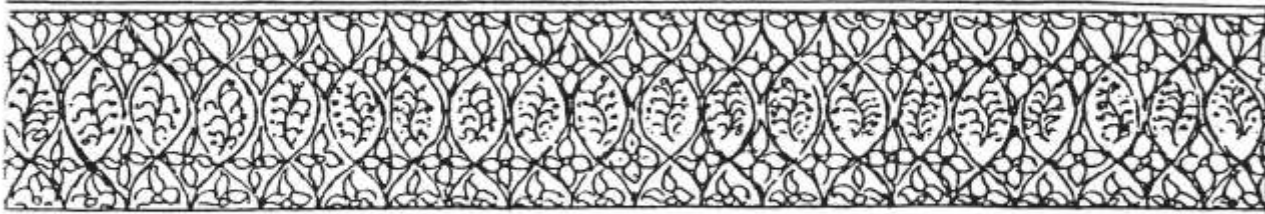
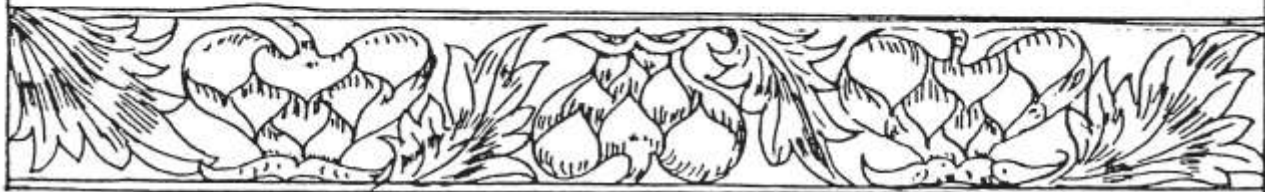

CHAPTER FIVE

1. (Page 67) The dates given in the following list of incumbents are the dates of Institution where these are recorded in the Bishops Register at Exeter. Capt worthy in his "Manor and Church of Winkleigh" pp 37-41 gave the first known list and Mr T Canon Hughes M.A. read a paper at Exmouth (1927 Transactions of Devonshire Association Vol 59 pp 311-22) on the vicars of Winkleigh since the Commonwealth. This is a carefully documented list with a few particulars of their families and obits. But the most complete and authentic list was made by Canon Chenter and Rev^d H. F. Nesbitt MA from the Cathedral records and is given below. The list, surmounted with a beautifully illuminated



border, is enclosed in an oak frame with a small metal label which states that it had been placed on the South wall of the Church.

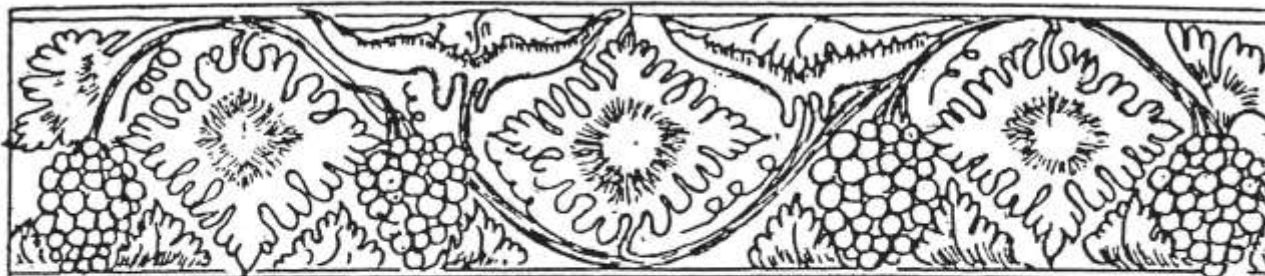

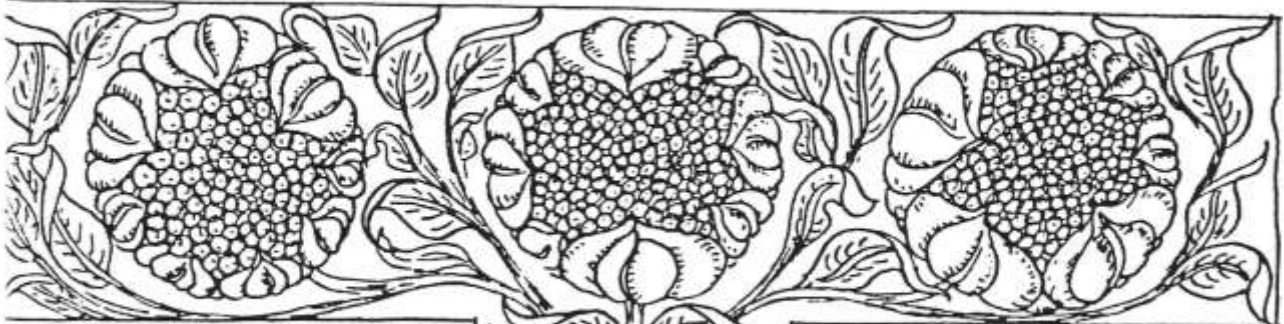

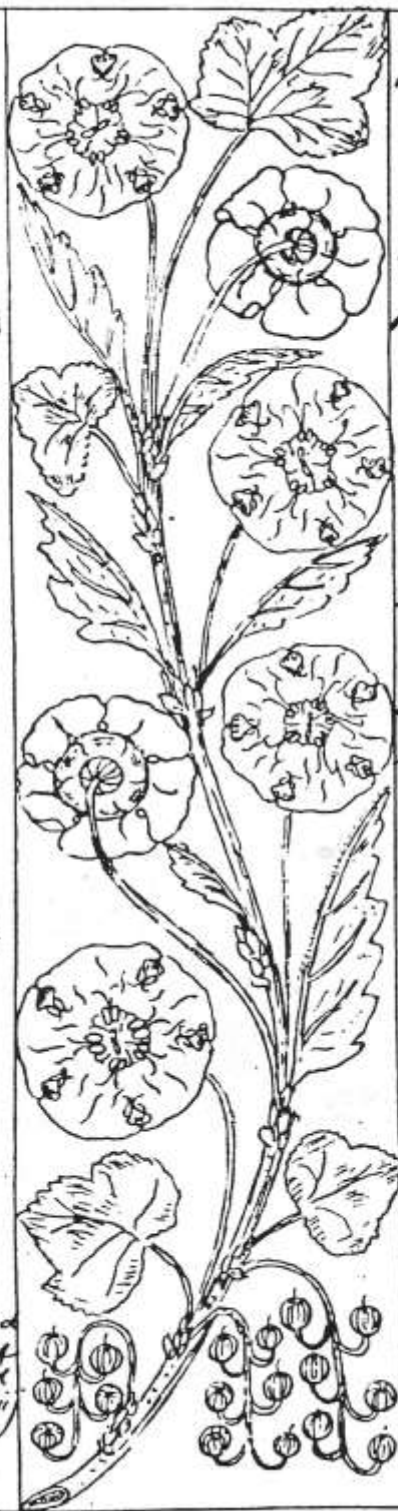
